**SUBJECT: 2007/2008 COUNTY SERVICE AREA BENEFIT ASSESSMENT/SERVICE CHARGE REPORTS**

#### Members of the Board:

Pursuant to Santa Cruz County Code Section 4.26, the Director of Public Works must annually compute the benefit assessment/service charge rate and submit a report describing each parcel of real property receiving the special benefit and the amount of the charge for each parcel for the forthcoming fiscal year to the Board of Supervisors.

County Service Area (CSA) No. 2, Place De Mer; CSA No. 5, Sand Dollar; CSA No. 20, Trestle Beach; CSA No. 33, Redwood Drive; CSA No. 35, Country Estates; CSA No. 41, Loma Prieta; , and CSA No. 51, Hopkins Gulch, 2007/2008 rates are brought to your Board today as a separate item as these CSAs are proposing fee increases, which are governed by Proposition 218 regulations.

The remaining CSA rates presented here have previously been approved by your Board and remain at the same level as 2006/2007 with the exception of 3.2 percent Consumer Price Index increases in CSA No. 7, Boulder Creek, CSA No. 10, Rolling Woods, and CSA No. 57 S and D, Graham Hill (Woods Cove) and a decrease in CSA No. 36, Forest Glen, King Road, Zone D.

As part of the annual proceedings, your Board must set a public hearing, notice the hearing and consider objections and protests, if any, to the data included in the benefit assessment/service charge report. Once today's actions have been approved by your Board, Public Works will place the benefit assessment/service charge reports on file with the Clerk of the Board. These reports, detailing the Assessor's parcel number, the owner's name and the amount of the benefit assessment/service charge, will be available on or before April 30, 2007, which will allow for public review two weeks prior to the proposed May 15, 2007, public hearing. As in prior years, the rate reports must be approved by your Board and forwarded to the Auditor-Controller by August 10, 2007, in order to be included on the 2007/2008 property tax assessment roll.

## SANTA CRUZ COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

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It is therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors take the following action:

1. Adopt the attached Resolutions Confirming Previously Established Benefit Assessments for CSA No. 7, Boulder Creek; CSA No. 10, Rolling Woods; and CSA No. 57 S and D, Graham Hill (Woods Cove).
2. Adopt the attached Resolution Confirming Benefit assessments for CSA No. 36, Forest Glen, King Road, Zone D.
3. Adopt the attached resolution setting May 15, 2007, at 9:00 a.m. or thereafter, as the date and time for a public hearing on the proposed benefit assessment/service charge reports for various County Service Areas.
4. Direct the Clerk of the Board to publish the attached notice of public hearing once a week for two weeks prior to the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation.
