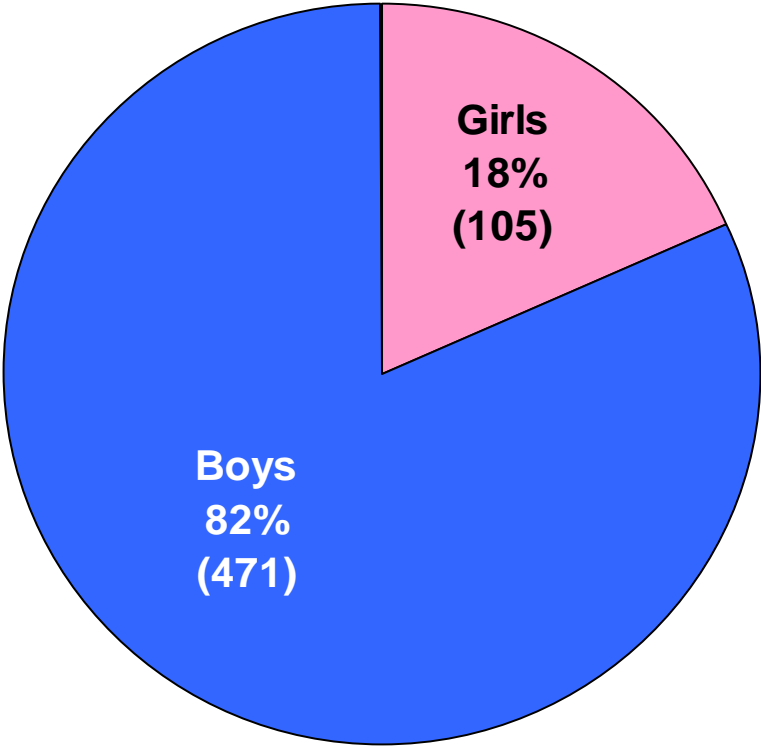

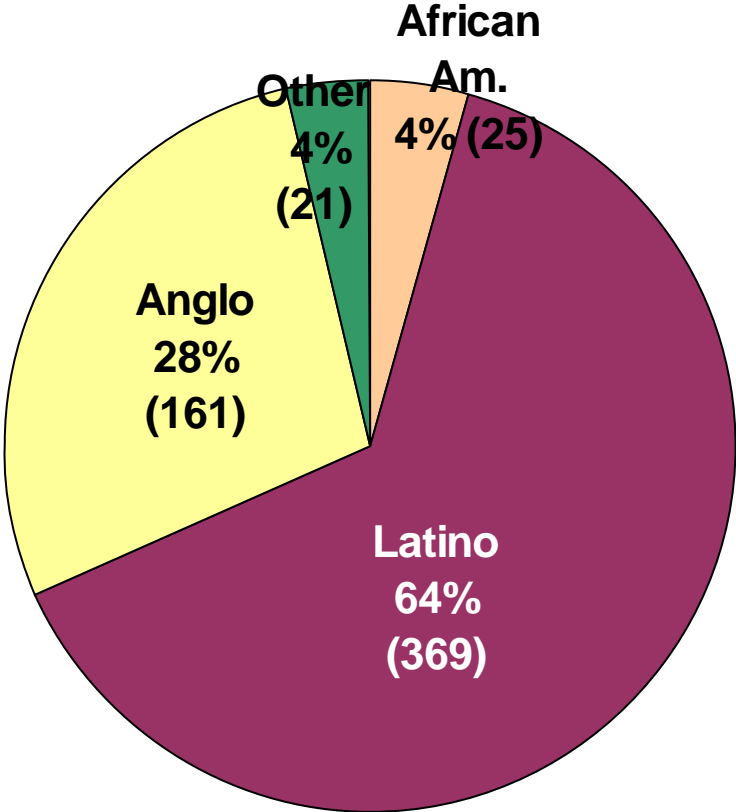

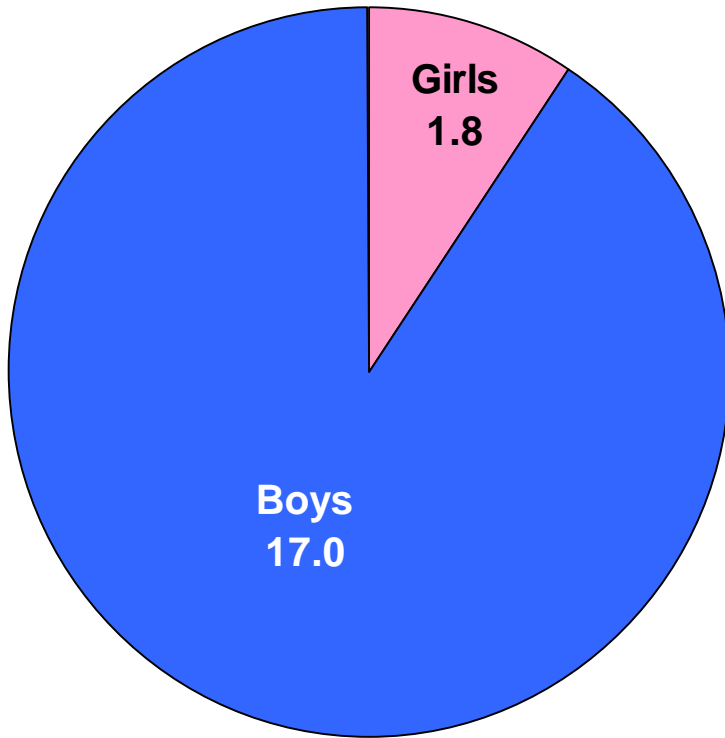

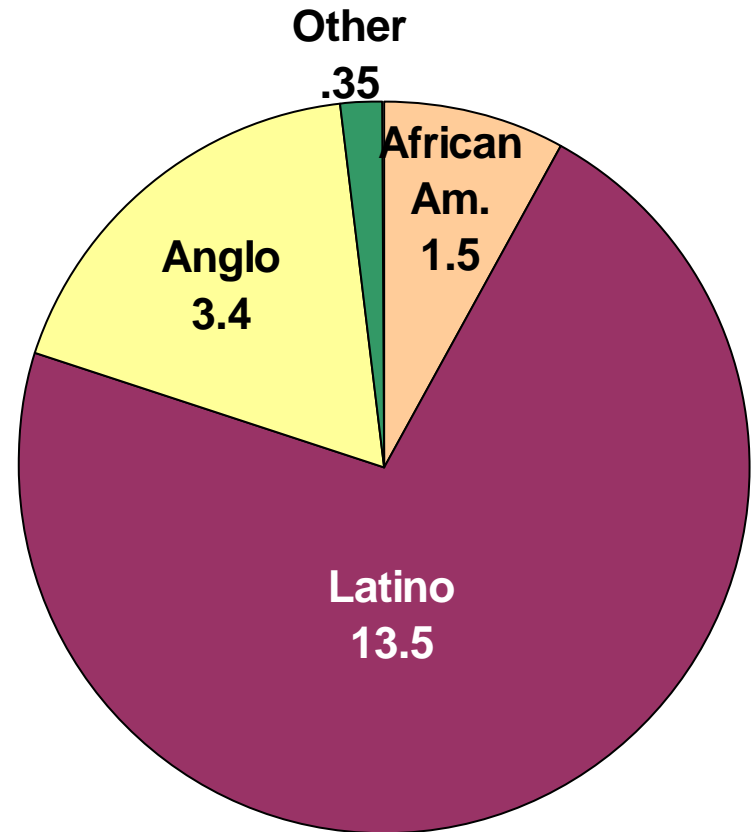

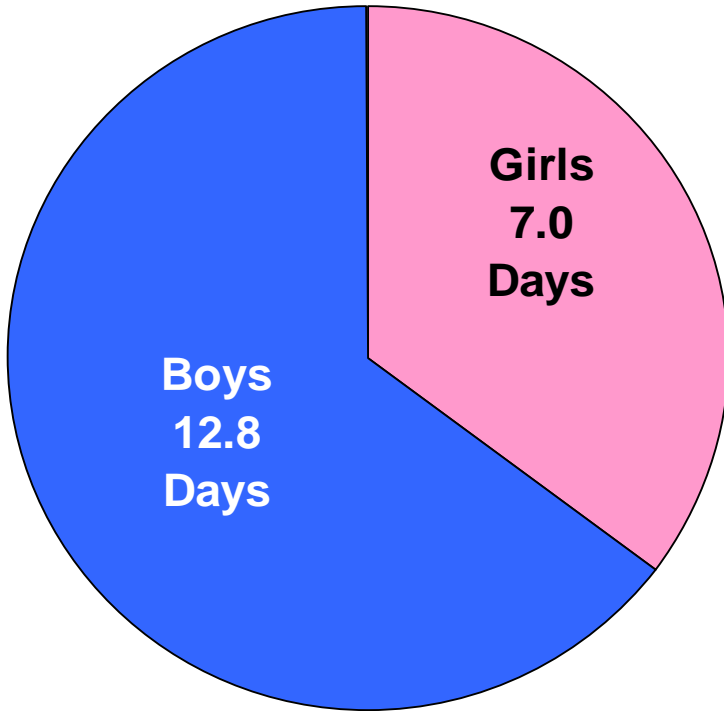

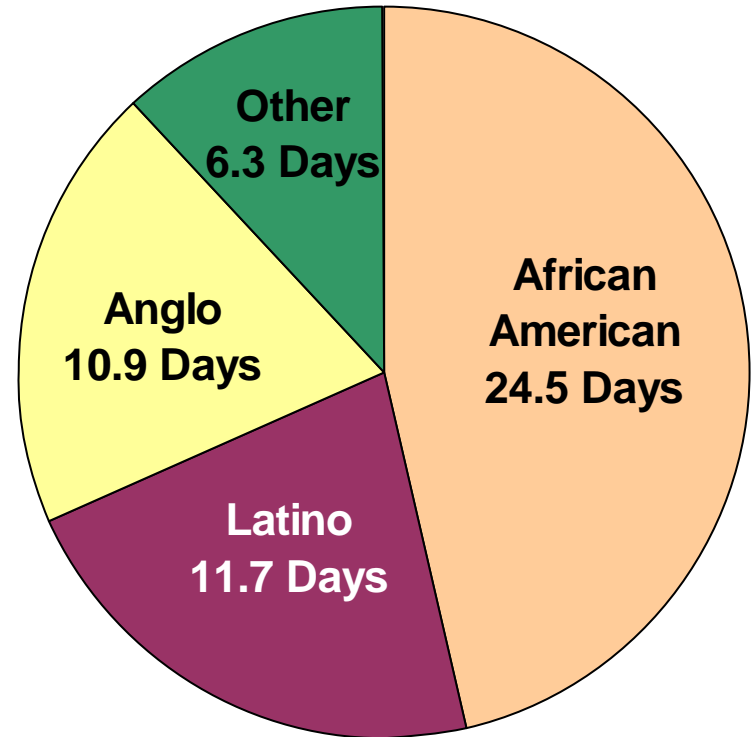
Average Length of Stay

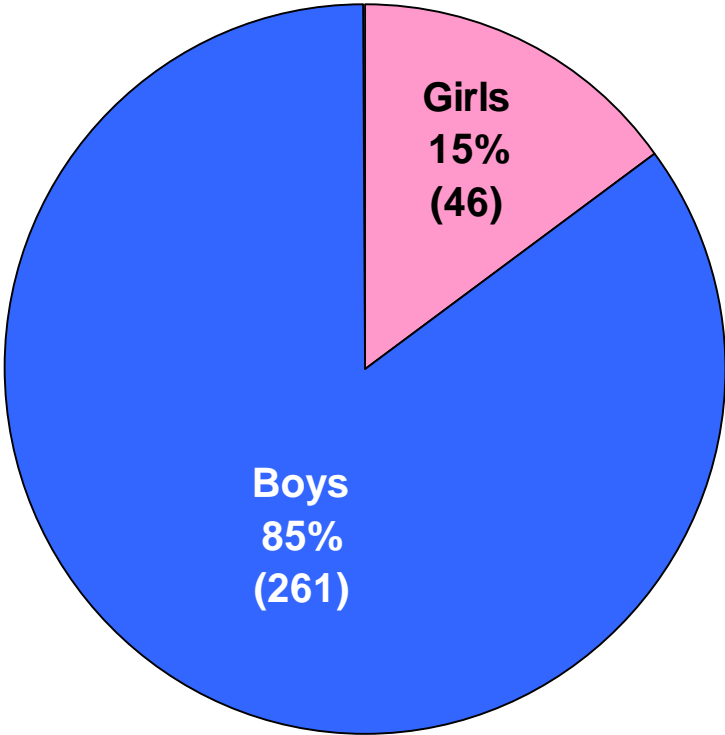

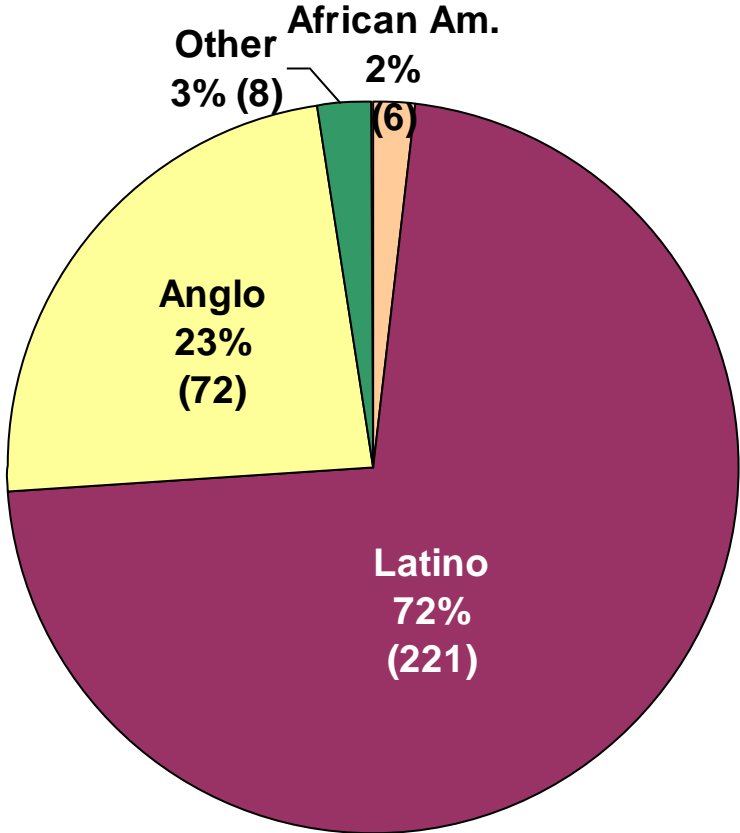
Santa Cruz County Detention Alternatives Home Supervision / Electronic Monitoring

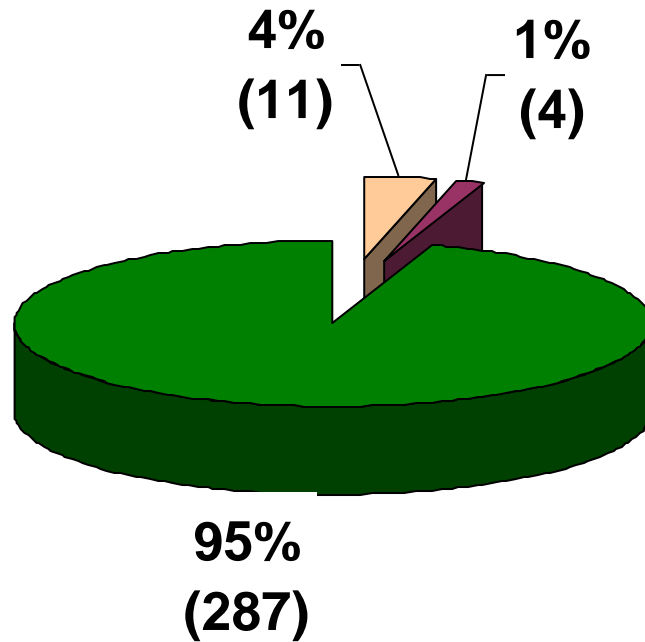

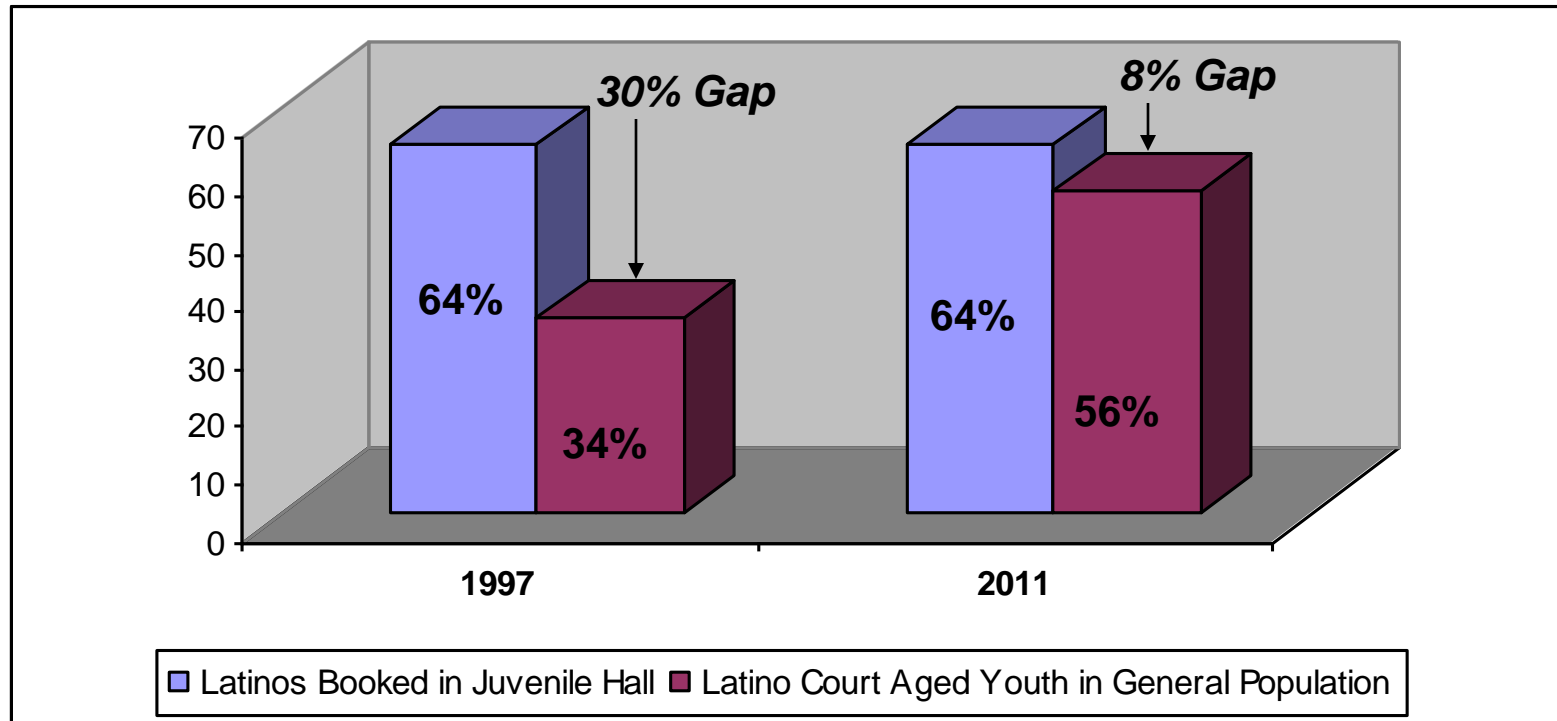

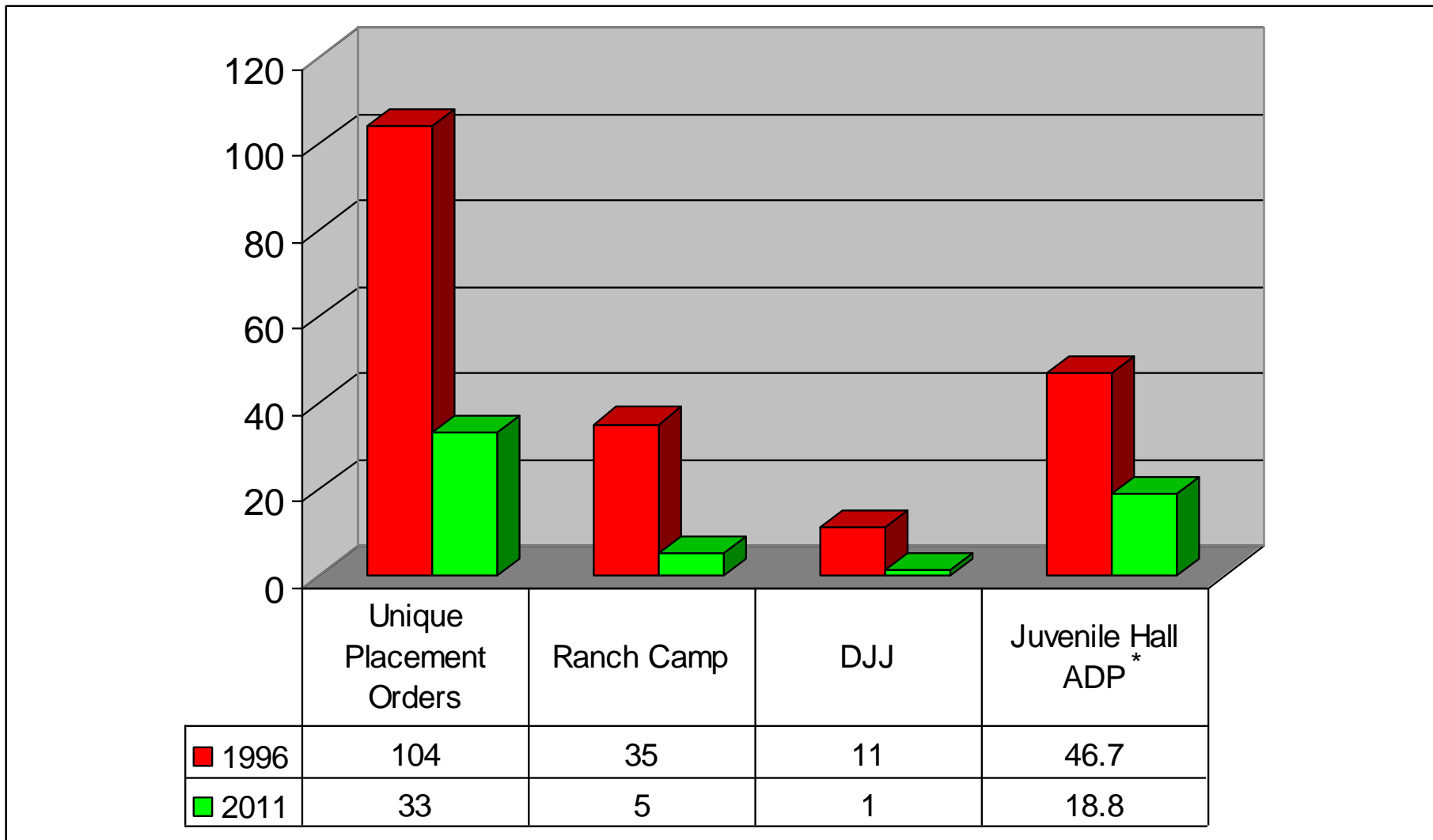
Santa Cruz County Juvenile Hall Reduction in Disproportionate Minority Confinement
